Challenges:

- No central database, results in duplicated svcs. - would be able to better support wrap around svcs.
- Updated directories of services, lack of info for clients
- Encouraging agencies to collaborate rather than starting own programs - no duplication
- Lack of capacity in rural areas - lack of time
- Movement outside of meetings
- Fear of the extra work collab. may bring
- Knowing who your partners are - big metro areas
- where do I start?

What's worked?

- Meets w/ partners
- leadership on board / buyin
- clear goals - what are we trying to achieve, take time to build relationships
- Advocacy agendas - support other groups leading the way on other policies - housing / wages / etc. healthcare
- Volunteers - buy in, share vision, ask for support, empower strong training - client interaction
- Community Mapping, understand local resources
- Formalize coalition roles + responsibilities
- How to keep groups engaged?
 - ↳ why are people involved?
 - ↳ concrete results that relate to everyone's day to day

What can you do?

- Community Mapping - shared transportation
- partner w/ local universities for volunteers

Collaborate on the bigger scale - not just food

Biggest Challenge of Collaboration

- territorialism - food banks, cafes, associations etc
- knowledge of who is out there - need more network opportunities
- difficult to coordinate - get in one group while recognizing individuality
- time - I feel stretched

Ideas that have worked (organizing & galvanizing)

- Being aware of local political movements
 - identify & bring folks together to work on the issue
 - strategically time your work
- Service Integration / Coalitions / non profit EDs groups
 - share newsletters, events, resources
 - collaborate calendars in events & fund raising
- Encourage folks to work together &
- creating a website of resources & opportunities as an information hub
 - featuring local businesses/ orgs on

1-3 things each agency can do


- research what's in place (asset mapping of groups)
